WA shipbuilders are still waiting for Malcolm Turnbull to deliver on the \$100 million infrastructure commitment for Henderson that he made over 14 months ago.

On the eve of the state election in February 2017 the Prime Minister told Western Australians that:

"We're backing them. We're putting in here \$100 million over the next few years to get ready for the Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPV)."
